The Citrus Disease Subcommittee was established as a subcommittee of the NAREEE Advisory Board by the Agricultural Act of 2014 (Sec. 7103). The purpose of the committee is to advise the Secretary of Agriculture on citrus research, extension, and development needs, engage in regular consultation and collaboration with USDA and other organizations involved in citrus, and provide recommendations for research and extension activities related to citrus disease. The Citrus Disease Subcommittee is also responsible for advising the Department on the research and extension agenda of the Emergency Citrus Disease Research and Extension Program.
