
# Our History

#### **Introduction of NASS**

- Established in 1863
- Named the "Division of Statistics"
- First report on crop conditions

#### **NASS Today**

- More than 800 personnel
- Serving all 50 states and Puerto Rico
- Centralized data collection and processing
- 3,000 enumerators







# What We Do

- Collect, assemble, process, and disseminate U.S. agricultural data.
- Conduct and publish hundreds of annual surveys and censuses.
- Conduct the detailed Census of Agriculture every 5 years.
- Partner with state ag departments, trade associations, universities, and others.
- Conduct research to advance statistical science.

### New and Noteworthy Projects

- Hemp Acreage and Production Survey
  - Release: February 17
  - Will include information on the total planted and harvested area, yield, production, and value of hemp in the United States.
- Local Foods Marketing Practices
  - Release: April 28
  - Provide data on local and regional food systems and provide new data on how locally grown food in the United States are marketed and sold.



### New and Noteworthy Projects, cont.

- 2021 Farm Producer Study
  - Data will be used to improve knowledge and understanding of agricultural producers and help USDA improve services to them.
- National Agricultural Classification Survey (NACS)

 One of the most important early steps to determine who should receive next year's Census of Agriculture questionnaire.



# 2022 Census of Agriculture

- Content Test Completed
  - December 2020
- NACS
  - Began December 2021
- June Area Survey/ACES
  - June 2022
- Data Collection Begins for the 2022 Census of Agriculture
  - November 2022
- 2022 Census of Agriculture Released
  - February 2024





#### Operating Through COVID-19 Pandemic

- The COVID-19 pandemic and related disruptions are causing a global crisis in business operations worldwide which have affected operations in the country, including the U.S. statistical system
- Data collection for NASS became more complicated
- Importance of providing relevant and timely statistics never wavered
- Pandemic has forced many public and private entities to ask the question, "What can be done to be better prepared in the future?"



## **Adapting Data Collection Procedures**

- Limited in-person enumeration
- Moved to "virtual" call centers
- Promoted self-administered data collection
  - Online
  - Mail
