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

1. <b>Goals.</b> What are the key research, education and extension programming efforts and their specific goals for each REE Action Plan Goal Area?	<p><b>Key Programming Efforts:</b> 1) Support research, education, and extension activities that increase knowledge and understanding of biological, chemical and physical food borne hazards with respect to their sources and ecology, mode of contamination, rapid detection, persistence/multiplication, level of risk, methods to prevent, reduce and/or eliminate the hazard, and resistance to antimicrobials; 2) Support outreach activities that provide food safety education, training, and certification for farmers, small vendors, industry, retail, inspectors, veterinarians, educators, consumers, and others along the food chain from production to consumption and; 3) Support the development and/or application of new or improved food processing technologies that improve the safety, quality and nutrition of foods.</p> <p><b>REE Action Plan Goal Area:</b> Food Safety (REE Goal 5). The goals of the NIFA food safety portfolio are to (1) develop programs and provide national program leadership focused on improving food safety, quality and nutritional value of the U.S. food supply; (2) effectively lead, manage, administer and evaluate food safety and quality programs, and report impacts across NIFA; and (3) Provide support for food safety and quality REE projects to improve safety and quality of the U.S. food supply.</p>	PD, p.9	<p><b>Key Programming Efforts:</b> <i>Research</i>-Nutrient function &amp; requirements for different populations; interrelationships among nutrients and food components; factors that influence human behavior; program development and evaluation; factors that influence high-risk populations and persistent health disparities; <i>Education</i>-Improved educational opportunities in nutrition through a) fellowships, scholarships, and outreach opportunities for graduate and undergraduate students; and b) funding for nutrition professionals; <i>Extension</i>-Direct and indirect information dissemination and educational delivery to target audiences (i.e., policy makers, nutrition education practitioners, health and education professionals)</p> <p><b>REE Action Plan Goal Area:</b> Nutrition and Childhood Obesity (REE Goal 4). The goals of the NIFA human nutrition portfolio are to (1) improve knowledge about the behavioral, cultural, and psychosocial factors that influence obesity; (2) develop successful obesity prevention interventions; (3) demonstrate linkages between consumption of nutrients and other bioactive components found in food and human health; and (4) develop interventions that include dietary guidance in community food programs.</p>	PPI, p.2; PD, p. 3
